#### As Emergency Orders End, Lifesaving COVID-19 Tools Remain Readily Accessible Throughout Los Angeles County

With recent decisions to end federal, state and local emergency orders related to COVID-19, Los Angeles County residents are reminded to continue taking sensible steps to protect themselves and others against severe illness and help keep hospitalization and death rates low.

During this new phase, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) is committed to ensuring easy access to free lifesaving preventative services, including testing, vaccinations and boosters, and treatment.

One of the most effective ways to prevent severe illness is to get the updated bivalent booster, which has been shown to offer boosted individuals increased protection against hospitalizations and deaths when compared to individuals who were vaccinated but had not received the updated booster.

#### Medi-Cal Continuous Coverage Ended March 31<sup>st</sup>: Important Resources



The Medi-Cal continuous coverage mandate ended on March 31, 2023. As of April 1, county offices throughout California will restart eligibility renewals to determine if current recipients still qualify for free or low-cost Medi-Cal.

Individuals with disabilities are at an increased risk of losing or experiencing a gap in coverage due to upcoming changes in completing the renewal process.

The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) has created valuable resources to help ensure that people with disabilities have access and the information needed to keep their Medi-Cal coverage.



## GUARANTEED SCHOOL ENROLLMENT FOR CHILDREN REGARDLESS OF HOUSING ARRANGEMENTS

The Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) and L.A. County Office of Education (LACOE) offers guaranteed enrollment for local students experiencing uncertain housing situations, such as a temporary address or no permanent physical address.

#### The federal McKinney-Vento Act and California state law guarantees enrollment if a student lives:

- In a house or apartment with more than one family due to loss of housing or economic hardship;
- With friends of family because they are a runaway or unaccompanied youth;
- In substandard housing, without electricity, water, or heat;
- In a family, domestic violence, or youth shelter, or transitioning living program;
- In a motel, hotel, or weekly rate housing;
- In an abandoned building, in a car, at a campground, or on the streets.
