

HEAT STROKE?

HEAT EXHAUSTION SYMPTOMS

- 1. Faint or dizzy
- 2. Excessive sweating
- 3. Cool, pale, clammy skin
- 4. Nausea, vomitina
- 5. Rapid, weak pulse
- 6. Muscle cramps

HOW TO TREAT IT

- 1. Move to cooler location
- 2. Drink water
- 3. Take a cool shower or use cold compresses

HEAT STROKE SYMPTOMS

- 1. Throbbing headache 2. No sweating
- 3. Body temp above 103 4. Nausea, vomiting
 - 5. Rapid, strong pulse 6. May lose

consciousness

AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT DISTRICT'S REPLACE YOUR RIDE PROGRAM

Could you use between \$9,500 to \$12,000 to replace your old car with a newer and more fuel-efficient car? Replace your high-polluting vehicle with a newer vehicle, e-bike, car sharing, or public transportation passes, through participation in the South Coast Air Quality Management District's (AQMD) Your Ride program. 

Get Fast, Reliable Home Internet with ACP

The federally funded Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) offers up to \$30 a month off High-Speed Home Internet for qualifying households. Now everyone can get online at the same time for less. Those with Lifeline mobile benefits can also get ACP.

To Be Eligible

someone in your household must be enrolled in at least ONE (1) of the following:

Lifeline

Free or Reduced School Lunch Program, CEP Schools

CalFresh or SNAP

Medi-Cal or Supplemental Security Income (SSI)

Pell Grant

WIC (Women, Infants & Children)

Federal Public Housing Assistance

Or has a Household Income of \$53,000 or less for a family of 4 (add \$9,000 per additional family member)

Note: The Internet Service Provider cannot require a waiting period or charge market rate before applying the ACP discount.





The State of California is proud to announce the launch of the California Kids Investment and Development Savings Program (CalKIDS).

CalKIDS gives children in California a jump start on saving for college or career training. To be eligible for CalKIDS, participants must be:

- 1. Born in California on or after July 1, 2022; or
- 2. An eligible low-income public school student in grades 1-12* in California.

All participants receive a seed deposit in a CalKIDS account to help pay for future education after high school.
