

New fares are coming to Metro on July 1st

Metro is simplifying how you pay your fare on bus and rail. It's easy to use, equitable and sustainable. These changes will make it easier for everyone who pays with TAP to earn free rides.

Tap for Free Rides

Metro is introducing fare capping, which means the more you ride, the more you will save. You will never pay more than \$5 in a day or \$18 within seven days. Once you reach the 1-Day or 7-Day fare cap, rides are FREE! Frequent riders will benefit the most.

This is less than the regular price of Metro's regular 1-Day and 7-Day passes, which are being replaced with fare capping. Fare capping for Reduced Fare customers is even less and varie.





Project Description:

Community input will inform the selection of a corridor for improvements, and proposed safety treatments for the corridor. LADOT will use low cost, quick to install materials (e.g. striping, street paint, signs, and bollards/delineators) to build out safety treatments.

Potential Enhancements:

High-visibility crosswalks, bike boxes, painted medians, striped/protected bike lanes, extensions, traffic circles, 15 mph speed zones, speed cushions

What Will Happen if COVID Cases Rise Again? Public Health has a Plan for That.

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) has updated its COVID-19 Response Plan to align with the new phase of the pandemic and the recent lifting of emergency declarations.

Because we continue to live with COVID-19, Public Health is staying prepared should the community experience future increases in COVID-19 transmission. This allows Public Health to respond swiftly, if need be, to reduce transmission and continue to protect those most vulnerable to severe COVID-19 outcomes.

Public Health will tie different recommendations/requirements to each of the three CDC's Hospital Admission Levels. Public Health will also continue tracking its Early Alert Signals, which monitor potential increases in transmission, to quide its COVID-19 recommendations.

EPA Opportunity for Youth 16-29


The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced the formal establishment of the agency's firstever National Environmental Youth Advisory Council (NEYAC). The NEYAC will provide independent advice and recommendations to Administrator Michael S. Regan on how to increase EPA's efforts to address a range of environmental issues as they relate to youth communities.

EPA is soliciting applications for youth to fill 16 vacancies on the NEYAC. Selected applicants will contribute to a balance of perspectives, backgrounds, and experience of the council and will be appointed by the Administrator. As a first-of-its-kind committee, all members of NEYAC will be between the ages of 16 and 29.



Oral COVID-19 Medicine is Available

As soon as you start to feel sick, take a COVID-19 test and seek free COVID treatment right away.

Treatment can prevent you from getting very sick.

The oral medicine Paxlovid has been proven to significantly reduce the risk of death or hospitalization from COVID-19.

Treatment must be started early. The oral medicines must be started within five days of when symptoms begin. Do not wait for your symptoms to get worse.

Many adults and some children qualify for **treatment.** You can get treatment even if you have had COVID before, or if you have been vaccinated. You don't need to have insurance or be a US citizen, but you will need a prescription to access COVID-19 medication.

See if you're eligible for COVID-19 treatment. Call the Public Health Telehealth Service at 1-833-540-0473 (7 days a week, 8:00 am – 8:30 pm). This is a good option for people who don't have a doctor or health insurance or can't get an appointment.


