

Information on the End of California's COVID-19 State of Emergency and the Federal Public Health Emergency for COVID-19

With the end of <u>California's COVID-19 State of Emergency</u> on February 28 and the end of the <u>federal Public Health</u> <u>Emergency (PHE) for COVID-19</u> on May 11, the California Health & Human Services Agency (CalHHS), along with its Departments and Offices, is providing Californians with information about various programs and services affected, including flexibilities and other policy changes.

In California, COVID-19 response efforts remain a public health priority even though the State of Emergency is ending. The state's <u>SMARTER Plan</u>, which looks at where the state has been and draws on lessons learned from our collective experiences, will ensure a level of operational preparedness to support communities and appropriately respond to future outbreaks.

LA County now offers unlimited free Wi-Fi access at all of libraries and parking lots. Wi-Fi access is filtered for all users by order of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors. Filtering cannot be removed. Customers are welcome to use available electrical outlets as long as no library equipment is unplugged and it does not create an unsafe condition.



#### The State of California is proud to announce the launch of the California Kids Investment and Development Savings Program (CalKIDS).

CalKIDS gives children in California a jump start on saving for college or career training. To be eligible for CalKIDS, participants must be:

- 1. Born in California on or after July 1, 2022; or
- 2. An eligible low-income public school student in grades 1-12\* in California.

All participants receive a seed deposit in a CalKIDS account to help pay for future education after high school.
