





#### California Community Reinvestment Grants Program



#### Community Resilience Centers Round 1 PROJECT DEVELOPMENT Grant

Funds planning, development, construction, and upgrades of local facilities to serve as Community Resilience Centers, providing shelter and resources during climate and other emergencies. The program will also fund ongoing year-round community services and programs that build overall community resilience. Application Deadline: September 18, 2023. <u>Learn More</u>

#### Reconnecting Communities: Highways to Boulevards Program

The California Department of Transportation has established \$149 million for the conversion of underutilized highways into multi-modal corridors to reconnect communities divided by transportation infrastructure. The historical harm will be addressed through community-based planning to address the transportation barrier. Application Deadline: September 20, 2023. <u>Learn More</u>

#### Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative: Early Childhood Wraparound Services

CA Dept. of Health Care Services (DHCS) released a Request for Application (RFA) seeking proposals for the third round of grant funding totaling \$60 million. DHCS seeks proposals to scale early childhood wraparound services among adults who work with infants, young children, expectant and new parents, and caregivers. Application Deadline: October 6, 2023. <u>Learn More</u>

#### Equitable Community Revitalization Grants (ECRG)

DTSC's Office of Brownfields Equitable Community Revitalization Grant will provide approximately \$185 million in grants through a competitive process for: Community-wide Assessments, Site-specific Investigations, and Site-specific Cleanups. Application Deadline: October 9, 2023. <u>Learn More</u>

#### \$125M for Consumer Electronics Battery Recycling, Reprocessing, and Battery Collection

This program aims to support the recycling of consumer electronics batteries and battery-containing devices to bolster the domestic critical material supply chain for EV batteries. Concept papers are due on August 17, 2023. Full applications are due November 29, 2023. <u>Learn more.</u>

#### Regional Climate Collaboratives (RCC) Program

RCC funds collaboratives of cross-sectoral and community-rooted partners, seeking to advance both place-based and region-wide climate change mitigation, adaptation, and resiliency efforts. Includes various capacity building activities, such as partnership development, project and plan development, data collection, education and training, and the creation of technical assistance hubs to pursue climate investments. Application Deadline: December 6, 2023. <u>Learn More</u>
