Turning Down the Heat in Dwelling Units

L.A. County Board of Supervisors adopted an <u>ordinance</u>establishing a maximum indoor temperature for rental units in unincorporated areas, aimed at protecting residents from extreme heat. The ordinance sets a limit of 82 degrees Fahrenheit indoors and grants tenants the right to use portable cooling devices such as plug-in air conditioners, fans, and blackout curtains without fear of eviction, retaliation, or extra charges. The ordinance also includes protections for tenants by limiting pass-through costs and prohibiting harassment tied to the use of cooling devices. LEARN MORE

- Your right to work










Earthquake Brace + Bolt Grant Program Opens for 2025 Applications – Now Expanded to Rental Properties

September 4, 2025 - The California Department of Insurance is proud to partner with the California Earthquake Authority to raise awareness about the Earthquake Brace + Bolt (EBB) Program, which is once again offering grants to help Californians strengthen older homes against earthquake damage.

Starting August 20 through October 1, 2025, homeowners across more than 1,100 eligible ZIP Codes can apply for grants of up to \$3,000 to complete a seismic retrofit. These upgrades help secure wood-framed houses built before 1980 with raised foundations, making them more resistant to earthquake shaking.



For the first time, the program is expanding eligibility to include rental and other non-owner-occupied properties—giving landlords and property owners the chance to safeguard more California homes and protect the residents who live in them.

Additional support is available for income-eligible households earning \$89,040 or less per year, with up to \$7,000 in supplemental grants to cover most or even all retrofit costs.

Since its launch in 2013, the EBB Program has provided more than 32,500 California homeowners with retrofit assistance, making communities stronger and more resilient in the face of earthquakes. More than \$20 million in funding will be available for this application period.




